DELEGATION ORDER No. 26 (Rev. 2) EFFECTIVE DATE: April 14, 2023

## **Authority to Disclose Identity**

Authority: Inspector General Act, 5 U.S.C. § 401, *et seq.* (IG Act), the Internal Revenue Service Restructuring and Reform Act of 1998, Pub. L. No. 105-206, 112 Stat. 685 (codified as amended in scattered sections of 2, 5, 16, 19, 22, 23, 26, 31, 38, and 49 U.S.C.), and Treasury Order 115-01.

The following positions are delegated the authority to determine, under §§ 407 and 420 of the IG Act, whether disclosure of the identity of an employee or other individual entitled to confidentiality under those provisions would be unavoidable during the course of an investigation:

Deputy Inspector General for Investigations
Chief Counsel
Deputy Inspector General for Audit
Deputy Inspector General for Inspections and Evaluations
Assistant Inspectors General for Investigations
Deputy Chief Counsel
Assistant Inspectors General for Audit
Special Agents in Charge

This authority may not be redelegated.

The following positions are delegated the authority to determine, under §§ 407 and 420 of the IG Act, whether disclosure to the Department of Justice of the identity of an employee or other individual entitled to confidentiality under those provisions would be unavoidable during the course of an investigation:

Assistant Special Agents in Charge or higher

This authority may not be redelegated.
